We have rooms available for our 2-day packages for both Christmas and New Year. For further information, check out our website or speak to either Carole or Judith.

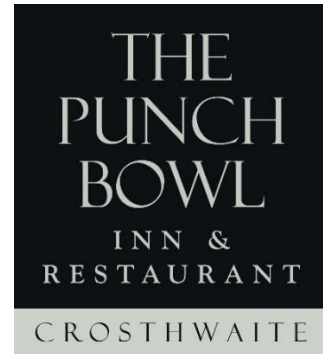
